Core PE




- You will all progress on to an accredited course which is currently one of:

Option Block A

What is the English Baccalaureate (EBacc)?



- The EBacc is not a qualification in its own right it's a combination of GCSE subjects, including a language, that offer an important range of knowledge and skills to young people.
- The Department for Education recommends a collection of core subjects, which make up the English Baccalaureate (EBacc), to help keep options for young people open:

English Language and English Literature

Maths

Science - Combined Science or 3 single sciences from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, or Computer science

History or Geography

A Language



Should I opt for the subjects included in the English Baccalaureate (EBacc)?



- If you are thinking of going to university, the EBacc is also recommended by Britain's most prestigious universities (Russell Group Universities).
- If you are undecided about your career path, this may help to keep your options broad
- However, it is not suitable for everyone.
- It is not something that we force upon you, if you choose to follow it, that is up to you.
- You must consider whether these are subjects that you want to continue to study and whether these are subjects that you are good at.





Design Technology Choices



- Students are only permitted to study 1 of the 3 Design Technology options:
 - 3D Design Using tools, machinery and computer-controlled equipment.
 - Graphic Design Using freehand and CAD software with hand tools.
 - Textiles Design Using textiles and fabric-based processes and materials.
- Alongside this, students can also choose to study a separate option in:
 - Food Preparation and Nutrition Designing and making Food products using healthy and Scientific principles.

Support

- Your subject teachers will talk about what their courses in Year 10 and 11 look like during lessons this week.
- Subjects that are an option that you have not studied in KS3 have recorded short videos to explain what they are all about.

What if I Change My Mind?



- Firstly, think very carefully before making your option choices
- Before the start of Year 10, let Mr Daniels or Mr Pearson know as soon as possible if you have a genuine reason for wanting to change we will try and do this (if possible).
- Once subjects start in September of Year 10, it is very difficult to change any of your options.
- In cases where you want to change, after timetabling, it is likely that you would have to change another option as well for the change to work.
- Whilst some limited changes may occur at the start of the year, there will be **NO CHANGES** after the first half term of Year 10.
- You will not be able to "drop" subjects at any point during your 2-year KS4 programme.
