What is Arbor?



 Arbor is the system the school uses to store all student and guardian information including registers/timetables, attendance, behaviour incidents, house points, contact details etc.



 Primary Schools use a variety of different systems to do similar tasks e.g. SIMS, GoForSchools, Bromcom, ScholarPack.



 Arbor is a cloud-based platform so it is easier for teachers and guardians to access and share certain information.







Planners




- Every student will be supplied with a planner at the start of the academic year.

- If planners are lost, a replacement planner is available at the cost of f1.













Planners include: timetables, attendance logs, character traits, daily diary, school map and lots more.


CAT and Reading Tests



- Cognitive Aptitude Tests completed within first 4 weeks.
- Tests done in the Sports Hall covering Verbal, Non-Verbal, Spatial and Quantitative elements.
- Combined with KS2 SAT's data to create Target Grades.
- Access Reading Tests completed on-screen within their first 4 weeks.
- Used to help identify any additional literacy support needs.






