

If you are a few minutes late for your lesson in your first couple of weeks, you will not be in trouble. You will soon find your way around the building. Don't forget there are plenty of adults and other students who will be able to help you around!





This is the canteen where you will be able to purchase food at both break and lunchtime. You will be able to buy lots of nice food and will need to type a code in at the till. You will be greeted by one of our lovely canteen staff who can help with any worries about your lunch money. You can bring sandwiches into school as well or your parent/carers can put some money onto your online account with 'iPay'.

Where are the toilets?
