| Focus | In Unit 1, students investigate and experiment with drawing techniques and media, extending their skills and visual language. Students do explorative and experimental observational drawing. Through analysis of both representational and abstract artists' work, they develop their expressive abilities and learn how to develop ideas. | In Unit 2, students study a contemporary and an historical landscape painter to further extend their understanding of technique. They experiment with different medias and methods of drawing and painting and learn how to develop their own ideas and personal outcomes to meet the assessment criteria of A-Level. | Developing the skills learnt in Units 1 & 2, in Unit 3 students explore the work of two contemporary figure painters, making drawings, developing ideas, and producing personal final outcomes based on their investigations. | In Unit 4 the work of two abstract painters is investigated, after which students make their own drawings and develop their ideas for final pieces. The unit is finished by making personal outcomes based on their investigations. | Unit 5 is the Related Study, which is a sketchbook based, illustrated essay (3000 words).
