No Phone Zone

Your phone should not be out in class unless specifically directed by the teacher.

Your phone should not be seen in any school corridors.

Headphones/ ear pods should not be worn in class or along corridors at any time.

If you choose to use your phone, you will have it confiscated.

Reason	Response
<i>I was just checking the time</i>	Use a clock/ buy a watch or your teacher will tell you when the end of the lesson is.
<i>My parent/ carer was getting in contact</i>	We have written to your parents asking them to contact the front office. You can check your phone at break and lunch.
<i>Medical</i>	We will contact your parents/ carers if needed. You should not use your phone at medical.
<i>I'm using it to check my timetable</i>	Use your planner.
<p>If you use your phone at the incorrect time, your phone will be confiscated and be given to the Student Support Centre</p>	



If you need to go to medical, you will be asked to hand in your phone at reception.

We will contact your parents if we need to.

It will be returned to you when you go back to class.

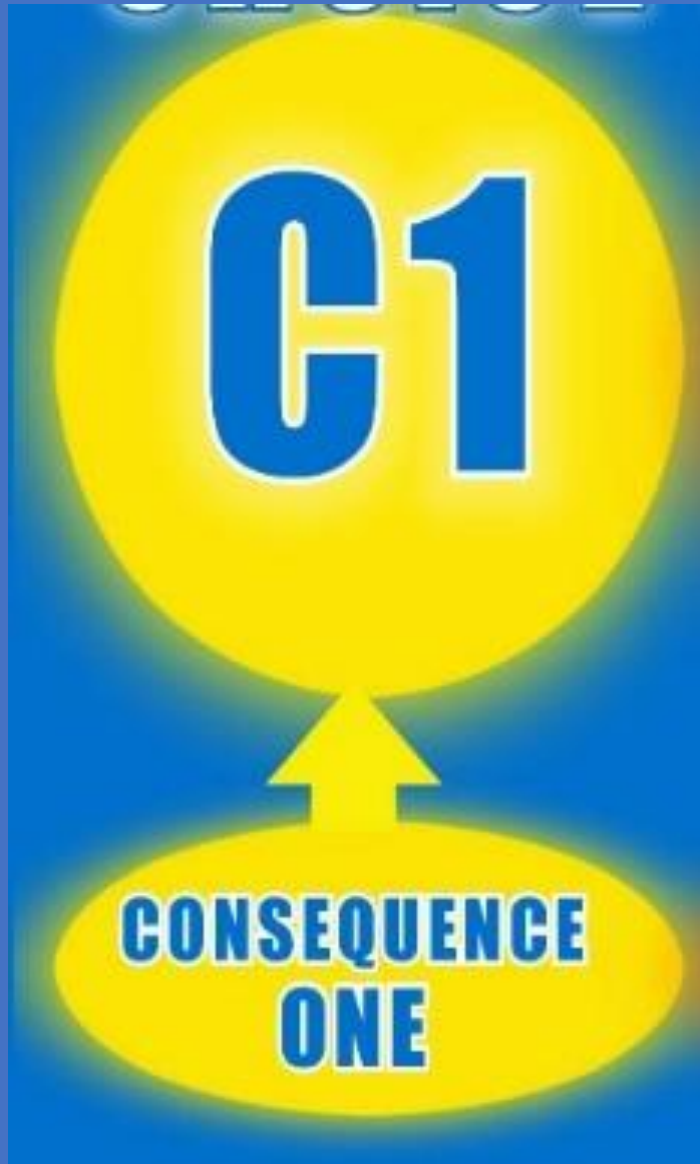
